

1. ABC-80. Denna svenska dator gjorde succé på den inhemska marknaden när den introducerades 1978, mycket tack vare sin svenskspråkiga kontorsmjukvara. 16 kilobyte minne, Z80-processor.
2. Apple II introducerades 1977, och gav upphov till en enormt framgångsrik datorserie som såldes fram till 1993. Priset pressades ner genom aggressiv förenkling av kretsarna. 4 kilobyte minne, processor av typ 6502.
3. Bondwell-2. En tidig bärbar dator med Z80-processor, 64 kilobytes minne och 8 timmars batteritid. Dock ingen hårddisk.
4. Commodore 64 såldes från 1982 till Commodore Internationals konkurs 1994. Den blev världens mest sålda persondatormodell med fler än 17 miljoner exemplar sålda. Populariteten berodde bland annat på dess goda grafik- och ljudegenskaper, samt att den såldes i vanliga varuhus och leksaksaffärer. Den hade 64 kilobytes minne och 6502-processor.
5. Amiga 500 introducerades 1987 som en billigare medlem i Amiga-familjen, och blev den mest populära modellen.
6. SPARCstation IPX introducerades 1991 som en kompakt medlem i Sun Microsystems familj av professionella arbetsstationer.

1. ABC-80. This Swedish computer became a huge success in the domestic market when it was introduced in 1978, largely on account of the office software being in Swedish. 16 kilobyte memory, Z80 processor.
2. Apple II was introduced in 1977 and gave rise to an enormously successful series of computers that were sold until 1993. The price was reduced through aggressive simplification of the circuits, 4 kilobytes memory, processor of type 6502.
3. Bondwell-2. An early laptop computer with Z80 processor, 64 kilobyte memory and 8 hours of battery time. However without hard drive.
4. Commodore 64 was sold from 1982 until Commodore International's bankruptcy in 1994. It became the world's most sold personal computer with over 17 million copies sold. The popularity was partly due to its good graphics and sound quality, but also to the fact that it was sold in ordinary department stores and toy stores. It had 64 kilobyte memory and 6502 processor.
5. Amiga 500 was introduced in 1987 as a low-cost member of the Amiga family and became the most popular model.
6. SPARCstation IPX was introduced in 1991 as a compact member of Sun Microsystems family of professional workstations.
